How to write detailed paragraphs regardless of the question.

Infer/Inference - a conclusion reached on the basis of evidence and reasoning.

Implicit - suggested though not directly expressed.

Explicit - stated clearly and in detail, leaving no room for confusion or doubt.

Conflict - a fight, battle or war.

Conflict is what all novels are about.

Contrast - to compare someone or something with another or others, or to show the differences between two or more things.

Tentative language - e.g. words such as 'possibly' and 'perhaps'. This tentative language forces you to consider ideas, and forces you to be sophisticated. It means you won't add extra detail that is simply waffle.

Climax - the most intense, exciting, or important point of something; the culmination.

Denouement - refers to the actual ending, when the writer pulls together the different elements of the story to offer a solution that matches their purposes.

Exposition - which means the back story. You will always find this relevant to the question if the source is the beginning of a book.

Register - a wistful or excessively sentimental yearning for return to or of some past period or irrecoverable condition.

Juxtaposition - two things that are put close together in order to emphasise the difference between them.

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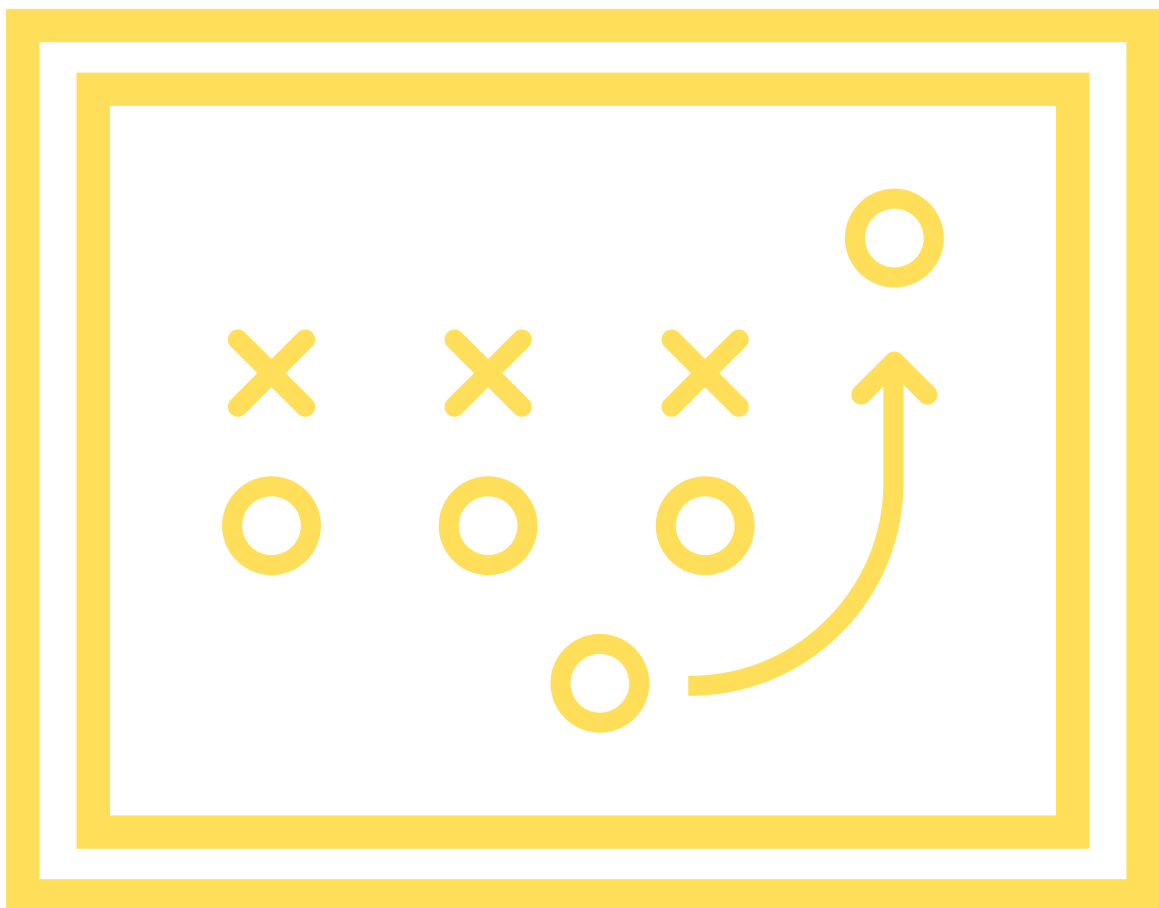

Tackling Exam Style

Questions

Another common struggle is answering exam questions correctly.

As a result, students find the look of a large question overwhelming, and they are keen to quit before they've even got started.

It's very similar to looking at your diary for the next year and attempting to tackle it all at once. One look and it's enough to reduce you to tears.

So here is what your child needs to focus on instead...Break down exam questions in components and categories that are easier to digest and comprehend. This will help your child because it will help them to efficiently build the pieces of their answer together, in order for them to complete the answer effectively.

Just as we would prioritise the events in our diary and assign them to a particular point of our schedule, we would coach your child on what and where to assign particular information. This enables them to work with sizeable pieces of information and achieve ample success.

Memorise 10+ Quotes from each book studied (GCSE English Literature)

I'd love to be able to give you a magic pill or swift shortcut, but sadly, there isn't one.

There will be some hard graft required which does involve memorising quotes from each book your child studies.

Usually, there are three books to study. One from Shakespeare e.g. 'Macbeth', and two modern texts e.g. 'An Inspector Calls' and 'A Christmas Carol'.

Schools will decide on a book for students to study and students need to memorise at least ten quotes from each book. The more quotes that are memorised, the higher the chances of succeeding.

But which quotes should be memorised? I advise to memorise quotes that are short and memorable e.g. coming from key characters. Secondly, your child should include quotes that are linked to a particular theme. This allows them to tie in their answer with key terms that examiners will love to see.

Once again, this is where I can help. I've compiled a list of key quotes with analysis from the main books studied by GCSE English students - so your child doesn't have to.
